

## **WRB04 Beauty Training Package (revised)**

The initial Beauty Training Package was endorsed in July 1999. The review of the Training Package began in August 2001 and was completed in October 2003.

The beauty industry is diverse in that it provides a range of specialised assessment and clinical services to client from very small businesses to larger enterprises operating in both cities and remote areas. Additionally, the industry has a retail focus through the sale of home care products via salons and retail cosmetics and skin care products through pharmacies and large department stores.

All units of competency have been reviewed. New units were added to accommodate new and future skill needs.

Units have been also imported from other endorsed Training Packages such as the Health, Entertainment, Retail and Business Services Training Packages.

Qualifications have been revised to provide flexibility through the creation of an elective structure for all qualifications and an increase in the number of available electives.

Three of the qualifications have been given title changes:

1. WRB20304 Certificate II in Retail Cosmetic Services to replace Certificate II in Retail Cosmetic Assistant;
2. WRB20204 Certificate II in Make-up Services to replace Certificate II in Make-up Artistry
3. WRB30104 Certificate III in Beauty Services to replace Certificate III in Beauty.

All other qualifications titles remain unchanged.

### **Transition advice for qualifications**

In implementing the WRB04 Beauty Training Package there are a number of considerations impacting on RTOs in relation to mutual recognition and scope

of registration. The following table provides advice on the relationship between qualifications from WRB99 and WRB04.

WRB50199 Diploma of Beauty Therapy	WRB50104 Diploma of Beauty Therapy	<p>WRB50104 replaces WRB50199 as the intent of the qualification remains unchanged.</p> <p>The total number of units required to achieve this qualification has been increased, from 29 to 33:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The number of core units required has not changed</li> <li>• The number of elective units required has increased, from 6 to 10</li> </ul> <p>Six units of competency which overtly address the application of anatomy and physiology, skin science, skin biology, electricity, nutrition, cosmetic chemistry and nail science to beauty therapy treatments have been included in the core. One which overtly addresses application of nail science to nail treatments is included in the elective bank which has been expanded,</p>
